Governors Building a More Efficient, Innovative, Smart & Secure Future

VISION

Moving people, products, and information drives America's economy forward and serves as the foundation for our nation's success. To keep moving ahead, we must repair, expand, and modernize our infrastructure in ways that will grow our economy, create jobs, and meet the needs of the 21st century. Governors across the country are leading the way, by upgrading roads, bridges, trains, and mass transit, improving regional and international airports, fixing aging water systems, providing high-speed Internet access and connectivity and keeping our infrastructure secure. The 2019-2020 NGA Chair's Initiative, Infrastructure: Foundation for Success, under the leadership of Maryland Governor Larry Hogan, will bring together thought leaders from government, business, and academia to work with the nation's governors in pursuit of a common infrastructure mission: building a more efficient, innovative, smart, and secure foundation for success.

GOALS

Infrastructure: Foundation for Success will focus on four pillars that represent key opportunities for governors to tackle:

- **Getting to Work: Relieve Congestion to Boost Economic Competitiveness**
Congestion costs America billions of dollars each year in wasted time, extra fuel costs, higher prices and environmental impacts. Governors can use innovative policies and new technologies to move the economy forward by reducing congestion to better move people and goods, connect people to jobs, and improve productivity; addressing gaps in transit service; breaking traffic bottlenecks that impact economic centers; and working with the private sector to meet workforce infrastructure needs.

- **Enhancing Efficiency: Eliminate Red Tape and Integrate Smart Technology**
Delays from duplicative and inefficient processes mean projects can take many years just to get started. Governors can speed up the delivery of infrastructure and reduce uncertainty and costs by adopting streamlined processes for permitting and review that increase transparency and meet environmental, planning and procurement goals. Governors can also help expand the use of technology to improve project planning and delivery, which can be made possible through policies and incentives that support expanded broadband connectivity.
- **Securing Systems: Protect America's Critical Infrastructure**
The growing use of connected technologies brings many benefits but also exposes our infrastructure systems to increased threats of cyber attacks. Governors need to work alongside private sector owners and operators to secure our most critical infrastructure, including the electric grid, oil and natural gas transmission and storage facilities, water treatment facilities, and the transportation network.
- **Financing the Future: Leverage Private Sector Investments**
Billions of dollars in private sector capital is sitting on the sidelines in search of viable investment opportunities and willing partners. Governors can help ensure that their states access the full range of infrastructure financing options by improving the understanding of and experience with private sector partnerships and innovative incentive programs such as Opportunity Zones.

ACTIVITIES

For each of the four pillars, the initiative will focus on identifying and sharing state best practices, exploring lessons learned internationally, and informing federal discussions through a suite of activities:

- **Infrastructure Stakeholder Summits**
Governor Hogan will host four summits, one focused on each pillar, co-hosted with governors from four states.
- **International Study Tours**
Governor Hogan will lead a delegation of governors to Australia, Canada and Japan to examine infrastructure innovations abroad that can be replicated in the U.S.
- **Streamlining Compact**
Governor Hogan will invite his fellow governors to urge federal action and commit to take steps in their own states to reduce delays, and the related uncertainties and costs, through improved project delivery that maintains environmental and other protections.
- **Storymaps**
NGA will document innovative state projects and policies in a series of storymaps that help governors visualize infrastructure challenges and opportunities.
- **Roadmaps and Legacy**
NGA will share leading ideas from the summits and study tours about how governors can take actions to improve infrastructure.
